Margaret Rubega is an Associate Professor in the Department of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology, at the University of Connecticut; where she also serves as the Curator of Birds, and the Connecticut State Ornithologist. She is an Aldo Leopold Leadership Fellow (2005 awardee), a fellowship aimed at training mid-career scientists to communicate effectively with the public, policy makers, and the press. She conducts training in technical and public communication.
